### **Mission Statement**

Parents/Guardians,

Welcome back to our campus! As we embark on the **return of our 1st through 3rd grade students** on Tuesday, September 8th, and TK/K/4th through 8th grade on Monday, September 14th, there are many important updates and information to make this as safe and smooth of a transition that we can plan for our Bobcats. **Please review this carefully.**

- **Arrival at school begins at 8:05** for our TK through 3rd grade students. Students may have a 'grab and go' breakfast and report directly to their classroom.
- For TK through 3rd grade, **school begins at 8:25 a.m.**
- **Arrival at school begins at 8:15 a.m.** for our 4th through 8th grade students. Students may have a 'grab and go' breakfast and report directly to their classroom.
- For 4th through 8th grade, **school begins at 8:30 a.m.**
- Dismissal will be 11:10 a.m. for our TK/K students, 12:00 p.m. for our 1st through 3rd grade students, and 1:15 p.m. for our 4th through 8th grade students.
- Students must be dropped off at the drop-off area in the morning. Parents **will not** be allowed to exit their vehicle and enter our school campus.
- It is going to be vital to the drop-off process that students quickly and safely exit their vehicle to keep the flow of traffic moving. All students will receive a quick temperature check, including their arrival on the bus. Any student with a temperature over 100 degrees will be asked to return to their vehicle or be sent home once we connect with their parent/guardian.
- During the first week of school, we will have extra staff to assist all of the students to their classroom. For our primary students, we suggest putting a name tag on your child, with their full name and teacher's name on the tag. You can also have this information written on a piece of paper or note and have your child hold onto this information, so our staff can quickly escort your child to their correct classroom.
- Under the National School Lunch Program, all students will receive free breakfast and lunch now through December 31, 2020. The meals are offered to both virtual and on-campus attendance students. Virtual Independent Study students can pick up meals from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on school days. Students who attend on campus will receive meals on campus.

Moving forward to a campus return, we also wanted to honor the concerns that families may have over a return to on-campus instruction. We were unable to configure our staffing for these students to receive a distance learning program during the full school day. What we can offer is a virtual independent study program. This will be designed for these students to connect with their teacher on a daily basis, virtually, for some instruction, support and engagement. In addition, we will continue packet pick-up for our teachers and the virtual independent students to pick up packets and drop off completed work.

For our parents/students choosing to stay in a virtual independent study program, here are the details important to you:

- For TK/K, the virtual session will be 12:30 - 1:53 and 1st through 3rd grade will be 12:40 - 1:43 pm. Your teacher will connect you with the appropriate links and online resources.
- For 4th through 8th grade, the virtual session will be 1:45 - 2:55 p.m.
- For students to participate in this option, we expect daily connection in these video conferences with their teacher and completion of all work. Attendance will be determined by the video connection participation. This means the student must have a reliable internet service and have the ability to complete most of their work independently.
- During the week of September 7th, packet pick-up will be 2:00 to 4:00 pm on Tuesday and Thursday. Starting the week of September 14th, packet pick-up will be Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, 2:00 to 4:00 pm.

**Safety Precautions:**

- It is very important that if your child is sick, to not have them 'tough it out'. They need to stay home until their symptoms are gone. If your child is taking medication to suppress a fever or have a fever over 100 degrees, they need to stay home and be fever-free for at least 24 hours before they return to school.
- In accordance with CDHP guidelines, **all students in 3rd through 8th grade** and all adult staff will be required to wear a face covering. TK through 2nd grade will be **strongly encouraged** to wear a face covering. The school will provide face masks, as needed. Medical exemptions to not wearing a mask must be submitted to our School Office and will be reviewed.
- Physical/Social distancing will be taught and continuously monitored. In addition, we will incorporate lessons on properly washing hands, limiting contact with eyes, nose and mouth and properly covering cough and sneezes. Hand sanitizer will be available in all classrooms and school buildings, with scheduled hand washing and sanitizing in program changes (recess/lunch/etc.) throughout the day. Classrooms will be set up to maximize distancing between staff and students. Guidelines for 6 feet social distancing only applies to adult to student and adult to adult interactions.
- Students will have recess outdoors and recesses will be by class only, to keep the classes together and not mix with others across campus. Lunch schedules will be staggered and classes will either eat outside or in their classroom.
- At this time, there will be no parent/adult volunteers on campus, until further notice. In addition, we ask that parents, during pick-up and drop-off, stay in their vehicle and not enter campus to pick up their child.
- **We are encouraging parents to transport their child to and from school.** Students will be spaced as much as possible and face coverings will be required for all adults and students in 3rd through 8th grade while on the bus. In addition, in appropriate weather conditions, windows will be open to increase ventilation.
